Our ideas take root in the serenity of Fuentes Blancas

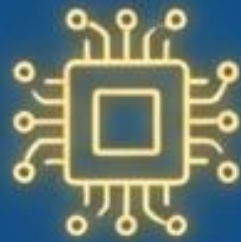

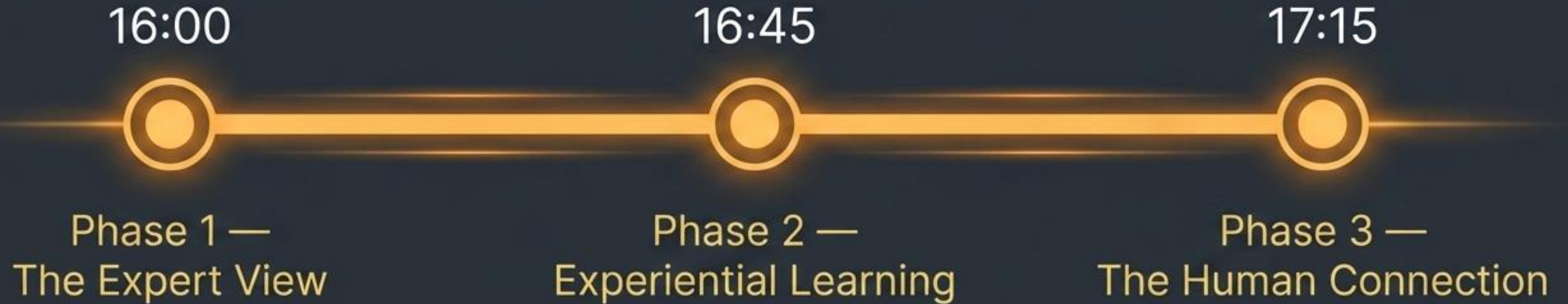

Phase two translates theory into hands-on sensory exploration

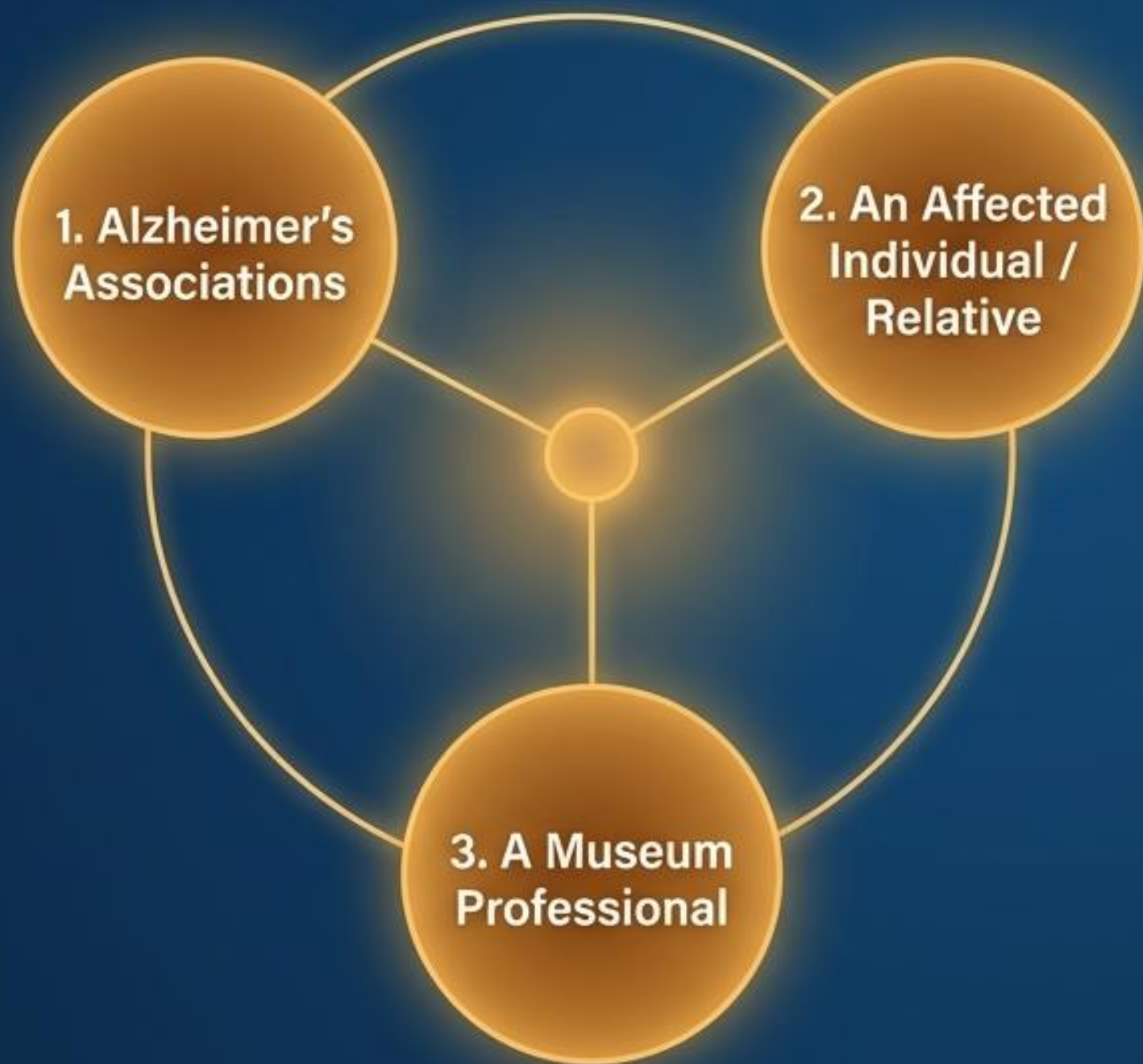
Duration: 30 Minutes
